RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, by prior resolution, the Tribal Council awarded a Home Improvement Program home in Carrizo to Bessie Truax, an elder member of the Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, prior to the home being occupied by Bessie Truax, she passed away and the Carrizo home now remains unoccupied on her family's property, and
- WHEREAS, her daughter, Diana Truax, who is over fifty years of age, is in need of a home and is living at the bare subsistence level, and
- WHEREAS, Councilmen Raymus Albert and Lafe Altaha, as representatives of the Carrizo District are fully aware of the economic standards of living of Diana Truax and the location of the Home Improvement Program house and recommends that after the house is inspected, that the Bureau of Indian Affairs turn over the house to Diana Truax.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that based upon her need, it requests that ownership of the Home Improvement Program house be transferred to Diana Truax immediately after inspection certifies it for occupancy.

The foregoing resolution was on January 18, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
