RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has always considered the physical maintenance of the reservation's boundaries to be of permanent importance to the preservation of the natural resources of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council had recommended during the BAND Analysis sessions (BIA Budget Formulation Process) that monies be allocated in the Trust Services General category to be used in support of the Tribal Land Operations boundary maintenance work, and
- WHEREAS, there is presently \$19,000.00 in the FY/84 Bureau of Indian Affairs Trust Services General category which could be utilized by the Tribe pursuant to a P.L. 93-638 Contract to perform the necessary boundary boundary maintenance work.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that a P.L. 93-638 Contract proposal be submitted to the Area Office of the Bureau of Indian Affairs to contract for the Trust Services General monies (\$19,000.00) effective February 01, 1984 to be used to provide necessary equipment, supplies and manpower in support of the trust protection activities of the Tribal Land Operations program.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby authorizes the Tribal Chairman or his designee to execute all documents necessary to carry out the purposes of this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on January 18, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
