RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has consistently recognized the social, economic and spiritual drain on the Tribe that results from the problem of alcohol and alcohol abuse, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has identified alcoholism and alcohol abuse as the most serious health problem affecting the Tribe and has documented this problem in the Tribal Specific Health Plan, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has expended considerable effort and resources in the development of a comprehensive treatment and rehabilitation program to alleviate this serious problem, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe's Rainbow Treatment Center for the second year in succession has scored the highest in the Phoenix area in a program evaluation of alcoholism programs conducted by the Indian Health Service.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby commends the Director and staff of the Rainbow Treatment Center for their outstanding efforts and dedication in the development and operation of this excellent program which has been recognized far beyond the borders of our reservation.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby expresses its deep appreciation for the efforts of other individuals and agencies including the Tribal Health Board, The Substance Abuse Task Force, The Tribal Guidance Center and the Indian Health Service who have significantly contributed to the success of the Rainbow Treatment Center.
- The foregoing resolution was on January 25, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
