RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Ms. Erma B. Cosay was previously assigned a homesite in Cedar Creek by the Land Board which was approved by the Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, there arose a dispute over the homesite assigned to her, and
- WHEREAS, in order to resolve the dispute, Erma B. Cosay went before the Land Board and relinquished all of her interest and claim to the prior assigned homesite, and
- WHEREAS, the sister of Erma B. Cosay, Loretta Dazen, has offered her sister a homesite on her farmland in Cedar Creek, and
- WHEREAS, Erma B. Cosay has requested approval by the Land Board to relocate her proposed HIP House on Loretta Dazen's farmland in Cedar Creek and the Land Board has granted its approval for her chosen area as a homesite, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council agrees with the relinquishment of the previous disputed homesite and agrees with the new homesite on the farmland now assigned to Loretta Dazen.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the release and relinquishment of the previous homesite assigned to Erma B. Cosay and further hereby approves a new homesite for Erma B. Cosay on the farmland located at Cedar Creek presently assigned to Loretta Dazen, her sister.

The foregoing resolution was on January 25, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
