RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has been advised by the Chief of the Construction Branch of the Phoenix Area Indian Health Service that due to the projected construction workload on the reservation that it will be necessary to outside contract or enter into a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the Tribe in various projects in addition to the Force Account construction work already scheduled, and
- WHEREAS, Indian Health Service has requested that the Tribal Council make a decision on the preferred alternatives in regard to method of procurement on projected projects as requested in a letter dated January 19, 1984, attached hereto and incorporated by reference from Mr. Perry Brackett, Indian Health Service, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council strongly desires to keep as much work as possible on the reservation for tribal members, and
- WHEREAS, a review of the various projects indicates that the Tribe has the expertise and personnel to successfully complete several of the major projects indicated.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that in respect to the above-referenced letter, the Tribe has decided that Contracts A,B,C and G itemized therein should be procurred through open market contracts and that Contracts D, E, F, H, and I, should be conducted through a Memorandum of Agreement with the Tribe.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe considers it imperative that the Indian Health Service maintain the force account crew as indicated in the above-referenced letter.

The foregoing resolution was on February 14, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Amache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe oune 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
