### RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Indian Health Service has agreed to assist the White Mountain Apache Tribe in developing a child restraint program on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe is desirous of developing an infant safety program to minimize the injury consequences to infants and toddlers victimized in serious motor vehicle crashes, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council does not warrant expressly or by implication, the century child restraint device utilized by the program, and
- WHEREAS, the participation by the White Mountain Apache Tribe in the program shall not consitute a waiver of the sovereign immunity of the White Mountain Apache Tribe for any purpose.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman of the Tribe is hereby authorized to execute the agreement for the development of a child restraint program attached hereto for the entire reservation, pursuant to the understanding that the White Mountain Apache Tribe does not warrant the seat restraint devices, and that participation in the program does not constitute a waiver of the sovereign immunity of the White Mountain Apache Tribe for any purpose.

The foregoing resolution was on March 07, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Moun-ain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

# MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA AND THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE

#### PROJECT NUMBER CIC - 84-001

This agreement, made among the United States of America, Acting through the Indian Health Service, Department of Health and Humar Services, and the White Mountain Apache Tribe, hereinafter called the Tribe, acting through the Tribal Chairman.

Whereas, the Tribe desires to develop a Child Restraint Program for residents on the White Mountain Apache Reservation.

Whereas, the Tribe, Acting through the Chairman of the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council, requested assistance from the Indian Health Service in the organization and implementation of a child restraint program for families in communities throughout the White Mountain Apache Reservation, and

Whereas, the Indian Health Service desires to help provide a mechanism whereby the Tribe can develop a self-sustaining Child Restraint Program.

Now therefore, to carry out the project, the parties mutually agree:

#### TRIBAL RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. That the Tribe consents to accept the fifty (50) Century 100 Child Restraint devices to be used as the start up portion of the tribal motor vehicle safety seat program.
- 2. That the Tribe agrees to sell the Child Restraint devices at or near the wholesale price and agrees to place the monies collected into a special account to be used to purchase additional seats as demand dictates.
- 3. That the Tribe agrees to function as the lead agency in providing training to all potential recipients of benefits of such a program.

#### INDIAN HEALTH SERVICE RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. That the Indian Health Service will provide without charge, fifty (50) Century 100 Child Restraint devices and locking clips to initiate a community-wide Child Restraint Program.
- 2. That the Indian Health Service will provide, without charge to the Tribe, technical assistance in the development and implementation of a Child Restraint Program.
