RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised by the Tribal Attorney, at the request of Don Booker, Tribal Administrative Manager, who was called away from the Council Meeting on tribal business at Pinetop, that Tribal Council approval is requested to increase reimbursement for mileage for employees and other persons on tribal business using personal or private vehicles, from the present rate of eighteen cents (18¢) per mile to twenty cents (20¢) per mile, effective with the 1984/85 Budget, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council advises that the Federal Government had previously raised their rate from 18¢ to 20¢ per mile approximately three years ago, and that other governmental and private entities have followed suit, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council rate should be raised from 18¢ to 20¢ per mile for persons travelling in personal or private vehicles on tribal business and where prior approval has been obtained for said business.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the increase of reimbursement for persons travelling in personal or private vehicles on tribal business from the present rate of 18¢ per mile to 20¢ per mile, effective with the 1984/85 Budget.

The foregoing resolution was on March 23, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
