- WHEREAS, the proposed amendment to Ordinance No. 137 in the form attached hereto has been posted for a period of ten (10) days or more, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise is in agreement with its final passage and the Tribal Council has not recieved any opposition to final enactment.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby enacts final passage of the proposed amendment to Ordinance No. 137 in the form and content attached hereto, said amendment to be effective this date.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby designates said amendment as Ordinance No.145.

AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE 137 OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE

BE IT ENACTED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the amendments to the White Mountain Apache Game and Fish Code are hereby proposed as follows:

That Section 3.3B be deleted from the Code:

Definitions, page 3:

17. "Indian" means any person of Indian descent who is a member of a federally recognized Indian Tribe according to the laws of that Tribe, and any other person recognized by federal law as an Indian for any purpose, and denotes both the singular and the plural.

Page 35, Section 6.11A:

No person shall, by fraud, misrepresentation, or assignment, obtain a permit to take wildlife, or provide such a permit to another by such means. A permit so obtained or provided is void and of no effect from the date of issuance thereof.
