

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has requested that the Bureau of Indian Affairs rebuild Route 71; I. D. Ranch Road, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe wishes to grant a gratuitous Right-of-Way, 100 feet in width, beginning .262 miles south east of Route 710 (to I. D. Ranch) and bears northwesterly a total distance of 4.301 miles to the intersection of Route 70.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants to the Bureau of Indian Affairs a gratuitous Right-of-Way as recorded on a map of Route 71, that is on file in the Office of the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona, to which reference is hereby made.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that no fencing of the Right-of-Way will take place on this section of Route 71.

The foregoing resolution was on April 18, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
