
RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the community of Cibecue, with a population of approximately 1,500 people is the most isolated community on the reservation involving a 100 mile round trip to the recreational facilities centered in Whiteriver; and
- WHEREAS, Cibecue, lacking recreational facilities experiences a high student drop-out rate, excessive teenage drinking problems and other juvenile delinquency problems; and
- WHEREAS, the youth of Cibecue lack swimming places due to contamination of the river from inadequate sewer systems and the flooding and erosion of natural swimming holes; and
- WHEREAS, the people of Cibecue need an outdoor swimming pool to provide a recreational opportunity during the hot months to provide a diversion from less healthy activities; and
- WHEREAS, the development of an efficient outdoor swimming pool can be managed by the existing Athletic Department, provide some employment during the summer months, and use fees to offset most of the operation costs.

BE IT RESOLVED by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council that the Tribal Planner is authorized to explore possible funding sources such as HUD or EDA for the development of an outdoor swimming in Cibecue and to develop a draft proposal for such a facility.

The foregoing resolution was on April 16, 1984, duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)
