## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Councilwoman, Judy Dehose, has advised the Tribal Council that her constituents have requested her assistance and that of the Tribal Council to establish a Laundramat in Cibecue, and
- WHEREAS, there is presently no laundramat facilities in Cibecue, thereby requiring tribal members from the Cibecue Community to travel to Show Low, some 60 miles away in order to use the public laundry there which causes undo financial hardship on the people, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that a location for a laundramat in the Cibecue Community is feasible and would provide a much-needed public service for the community.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the concept of locating a public laundramat in the Cibecue Community.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby requests Councilwoman, Judy Dehose to explore different financing sources for the construction of such a laundramat and to further explore and present to the Council, a suggested site for the laundramat.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that any location for the laundramat must be approved by the Land Board and Tribal Council so as to insure compliance with the Tribe's water quality standards and Tribe's Safe Drinking Water Act.

The foregoing resolution was on April 26, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
