



RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Mrs. Virginia (Altaha) Valadez, a tribal member who presently rents a home from the Tribal Housing Authority, has come before the Tribal Council complaining about a rental bill she is being asked to pay of over two hundred dollars that she received from the Housing Authority, despite the fact that she had previously contacted the Housing Authority Business Office and had been advised by that Office that they agreed with her receipts which proved she did not owe the two hundred dollars, but only owed \$40.00 which she has since paid, and
- WHEREAS, Mrs. Valadez reminds the Tribal Council that she had approached the Council about this very same problem approximately two months ago, but that the problem still remains unresolved, that she is still receiving the bill and demand for payment from the Housing Authority Office to pay the \$200.00 which she does not owe, and
- WHEREAS, Councilwoman, Mrs. Gertie Lupe is Mrs. Valadez's Council representative and is familiar with her problem, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council requests that Councilwoman, Mrs. Gertie Lupe and Mrs. Valadez meet with the appropriate Housing Authority officials for the purpose of thoroughly reviewing the accounting records pertaining to Mrs. Valadez's account and to determine, once and for all, the correct balance, if any, and to finally resolve the matter so that Mrs. Valadez's credit rating will not suffer, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that the Housing Authority Commission plans to convene its regularly scheduled monthly meeting on Tuesday, May 22, 1984 and the Tribal Council requests that the Commission grant time to Mrs. Valadez and her representative, Councilwoman, Mrs. Gertie Lupe to address the Commission in respect to this matter after they have reviewed Mrs. Valadez's account.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that Councilwoman, Mrs. Gertie Lupe be granted access to the Housing Authority Accounting Records pertaining to Mrs. Valadez and that she be permitted to thoroughly review those payment records to determine the correct balance due and owing, if any, to the Housing Authority.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it further requests the Housing Authority Commission to grant time, at its regularly scheduled meeting now set for May 22, 1984 for Councilwoman, Mrs. Gertie Lupe and her constituent, Mrs. Virginia (Altaha) Valadez, to bring this matter before the Housing Commission and to finally resolve her complaint.

The foregoing resolution was on May 16, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
