RESOLUTION OF THE

WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE

FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHERFAS, for fiscal year 1984 the Fort Apache Indian Agency has a tentative allocation of \$29,300.00 for Agriculture Extension Services, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has submitted a proposal to contract, under the auspices of P.L. 93-638, Agriculture Extension Services FY/84 appropriated funds, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe wants to make efficient and productive use of the FY/84 funds, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe wishes all tribal members to live in safe, decent and sanitary homes, and
- WHEREAS, the housing inventory taken through September 30, 1983 shows that there are approximately five hundred (500) houses that need repair or replacement, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe now determines that the need for adequate housing for tribal members is of a higher priority than Agriculture Extension Services.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the areau of Indian Affairs, Fort Apache Indian Agency, is hereby requested to transfer \$29,300.00 from Agriculture Extension Services and place that amount into the Agency line item for Home Improvement Program housing.

The foregoing resolution was on May 16, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
