RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Fred Larzelere, Sr. has written the Tribal Chairman with a request that the Home Improvement Program home that had been formerly built and assigned to his wife Cordelia Larzelere, now deceased, be transferred to his oldest daughter, Bernita Roberts, as owner, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, after discussion, concludes that it would be fair and equitable to assign the home to Bernita Roberts and that she is very deserving of a home and further, that it is only right that her deceased mother's home be assigned to her for familial reasons as well as justifiable need.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby transfers ownership of the Home Improvement Program home formerly assigned to Cordelia Larzelere, now deceased, to her daughter, Bernita Roberts.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby authorizes the Chairman and Vice-Chairman to execute any and all documents necessary to accomplish the transfer of this home to Bernita Larzelere Poberts.

The foregoing resolution was on May 16, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
