## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Mr. Basil Malone was selected as a recipient of a Category D new home under the FY/84 HIP Contract, and
- WHEREAS, because of problems encountered with his lot; in that, it overlaps the Tribal Welfare Housing Unit lot in which he presently resides, it was determined not feasible to build a HIP home on said lot, and
- WHEREAS, Councilwoman Gertie Lupe discussed this problem with Basil and Nellie Malone and they stated that they would be willing to relinquish recipient rights to the HIP home scheduled to be constructed for them this summer under the FY/84 HIP Contract, if ownership of the welfare housing unit that they are presently living in would be legally turned over to them, and
- WHEREAS, in addition and in further consideration, should any funding become available in the future, Basil and Nellie Malone would be considered for a remodeling addition to their welfare unit home in which they presently reside, and
- WHEREAS, after thorough review and discussion, the Tribal Council agrees to legally turn over ownership of the Tribal Welfare Housing Unit in question to Basil and Nellie Malone with the condition that they get a land assignment for said lot, that the Tribe will no longer be responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of said unit, and that it shall be the sole responsibility of the new owners (Basil and Nellie Malone) to maintain and upkeep this home, including purchase of insurance, utility payments and any other owner-type responsibilities.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that ownership of the aforedescribed Tribal Welfare Housing Unit is hereby legally turned over to Basil and Nelline Malone, the effective date of which shall be based on Land Board approval of a land assignment for said lot.

The foregoing resolution was on June 6, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
