RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Councilwoman Judy Dehose has invited Mr. Richard Finley, the Instructor for housing construction for the JTPA Program, to come before the Tribal Council and make a presentation on the advantages of constructing houses with the Rammed Earth process, and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Finley has presented an extensive explanation and demonstration of the Rammed Earth housing construction process, and
- WHEREAS, Councilwoman Judy Dehose recommends and requests Tribal Council approval for the construction of three homes constructed by the Rammed Earth process at a cost of approximately \$7,000.00 per unit to be financed by approximately \$22,000.00 from Fy/83 HIP Program carryover funds, and
- WHEREAS, it has been decided by the Tribal Council that the three homes shall be located in the communities of Canyon Day, Cibecue and Carrizo and assigned to the tribal members below based upon their needs as follows:

Cibecue - Ms. Zella (Danford) Yardley Carrizo - Mr. Carson Foster Canyon Day - Mr. Press Burnette, and

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that the Rammed Earth process is a process worth exploring in terms of economy, durability, fire safety and aesthetics.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes and directs that FY/83 HIP Program carryover funds in the amount of \$22,000.00 be allocated equally for the construction of three Rammed Earth homes as follows:

Cibecue - Ms. Zella (Danford) Yardley Carrizo - Mr. Carson Foster Canyon Day - Mr. Press Burnette

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that these homes shall follow the floor blueprints for the regular family units and shall be constructed by the JTPA funded labor force.

The foregoing resolution was on June 7, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
