## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Brother, Samuel Harris, a member of the San Carlos Apache Tribe has requested the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, for permission to hold a revival services by his church and its congregation on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, plans have been arranged to hold the revival on the homestead of Mr. Rustin Cheney, Sr. and his wife, Angela (Wool) Cheney, members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, the land is located across the river, north of the old School Orchard, Whiteriver, Arizona, and
- WHEREAS, the date of the revival will commence on July 28, 1984 for approximately a month or less.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves permission for a Miracle Church Revival to be conducted by Brother Samuel Harris at Whiteriver, Arizona beginning July 28, 1984 for approximately one month or less.
