RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe historically has supported, by donations of various foods and commodities, the needs of indigent families for wakes and funerals; part of such support being provided by donations of livestock from the Tribal Herd; and
- WHEREAS, because of lax screening procedures and pressures from noneligible recipients, in recent years the number of donated animals has increased to the point where the existence of the Tribal Herd is in jeopardy;
- BE IT RESOLVED that, effective immediately, the following criteria and procedures will be applied to the donation of livestock from the Tribal Herd:
 - Only families identified from official records as truly indigent shall be eligible for one (1) donated animal;
 - 2. Funerals and wakes only are eligible: no other ceremonials or dedications will qualify;
 - 3. No heifers or other essential breeding stock shall be donated; steers or cull animals only shall be donated;
 - 4. The Tribal Chairman and/or Vice-Chairman only are designated to authorize donations.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the above restrictions shall apply for a two-year period, subject to review by the Tribal Council sixty (60) days prior to expiration.

The foregoing resolution was on 07-24-1984 duly adopted by a vote of for 10 and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 17, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1008, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
