


RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Rev. Morris Belknap has come before the Tribal Council with a request that he be granted permission to conduct a ten-day Revival Tent Meeting for religious purposes in Whiteriver, sometime in September, 1984, the specific area to be recommended to the Council by Kino Kane, a tribal member, and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is of the opinion that permission should be granted to the Rev. Morris Belknap to conduct a religious Revival Tent Meeting in Whiteriver, sometime in September, 1984 because of the past beneficial effect such meetings have had for tribal members.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants permission to the Rev. Morris Belknap to conduct a ten-day religious Revival Tent Meeting in the area of Whiteriver, during September, 1984, the specific area to be chosen by tribal member, Kino Kane.

The foregoing resolution was on August 8, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
