RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is concerned about the progress being made to execute the contracts and to acquire HUD funding for the construction of approximately 114 units for HUD Project Ariz. 16-30 on the reservation, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is also interested in an explanation why rental units are rented at such high rates and why receipt of the HUD grant for the construction of Mutual-Help Units has been seemingly delayed, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that the Tribal Attorney should formally write the Director of the Tribal Housing Authority and request an explanation in detail answering the Tribal Council's concerns set forth herein.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Tribal Attorney to formally request from the Tribal Housing Authority Director, an explanation as to why the HUD contract and monies for approximately 114 Mutual-Help Units has been delayed, why the rates for the rental units has increased to a point where tribal members are unable to pay the going rate and whether or not the HUD Regional Office in Phoenix is being unfair to the White Mountain Apache Tribe by withholding HUD monies for the construction of the Mutual-Help Units on the reservation known as Ariz. Project 16-30.

The foregoing resolution was on August 9, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
