RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, tribal member, Gary Riley, Sr. has come before the Tribal Council for assistance in respect to his two children, and
- WHEREAS, specifically, Gary Riley, Sr. advises the Tribal Council that he was married to a non-Indian, but that they are presently divorced and that his ex-wife was awarded custody of the children and now resides off the reservation, and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Riley explains to the Tribal Council that he is having difficulty obtaining custody of the children so that his children can be enrolled as tribal members because of the fact that custody has been granted to his ex-wife, and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Riley requested that the Tribal Council grant enrollment rights to his children pending for restoration of the custody of the children to him at such time as his health is restored, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council agrees with Mr. Riley's request and concludes that the children having satisfied the blood degree necessary by the Tribal Constitution and By-Laws should be enrolled in the White Mountain Apache Tribe and no opposition be made thereto.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants the children of Mr. Gary Riley, Sr.; namely, Gary Riley, Jr. and Eva Pearl Riley, to be enrolled with the White Mountain Apache Tribe, effective this date.

The foregoing resolution was on September 19, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article III, Section 1 (d) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
