RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe recognizes potential benefits in systematic administrative and accounting practices for Tribal Government and enterprise entities, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is determined to develop Tribal planning policies for reservation natural resources, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe recognizes that uniform Tribal management/accounting practices, and natural resources planning functions are vital to the future of the Apache Culture and future generations, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe agrees with the intent of P. L. 93-638, the "Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act," and its purposes of: 1.) Strengthening and Improving Administration of Tribal Government, and 2.) Planning, Training, Evaluation or other activities designed to improve the capacity of an Indian Tribe to enter into a contract or contracts pursuant to section 102 of the act.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves a Tribal proposal to utilize federal appropriations to the Tribe from P. L. 93-638 in FY/85, in the amount of \$150,528.00 for the development of Uniform Management/Accounting Systems and Natural Resources Planning.

The foregoing resolution was on January 10, 1985 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 2 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
