RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Mr. Toledo Massey has requested Tribal Council assistance through his mother, Mrs. Virginia Massey for the return of his wife and children, who she reports, with the assistance of the Tribal Guidance Center, abandoned the family home and were placed in a shelter home off the reservation, and
- WHEREAS, Mrs. Massey explains to the council some of the details and family problems gave rise to the off-reservation placement of the family and explains to the council the deep sorrow, excessive drinking by her son; that her son is threatening to take his own life as the result of the placement of his family by the Guidance Center off the reservation and; thereby, request that the Tribal Council assist him for the immediate return to the family home, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that the Tribal Guidance Center should take all immediate steps for the return of the family to the reservation and that they utilize their counseling services to restore harmony on an intensive daily basis.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs Mr. Tom Gonzales to take all necessary and immediate steps for the return of the Toledo Massey family from the shelter home to the reservation home and the Tribal Guidance Center utilize intensive counseling in order to restore harmony to the Massey family.

The foregoing resolution was on January 10, 1985 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
