## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is committed to quality behavioral health, social and judicial services for its members, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is built v on the strengths of its component family units, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe recognizes that therapeutic counseling services to troubled Apache families will further strengthen the Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe further recognizes the need to provide specialized treatment services to juveniles to prevent them from repeatedly cycling through the judicial system, and
- WHEREAS, the Indian Child Welfare Act, P.L. 95-608, Title II, provides for the Department of the Interior, Bureau of Indian Affairs, to provide grants to tribes for said tribes to provide such services, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council authorizes the Tribal Chairman and in his absence the Vice-Chairman to negotiate and execute such grants and/or any amendments, and
- WHEREAS, the authority granted under this resolution to the Tribal Chairman and in his absence the Vice-Chairman shall run concurrent with the term of the grant.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain apache Tribe that it hereby requests from the Fort Apache Indian Agency, Bureau of Indian Affairs, a grant to provide services to Families at Risk to be administered by the Apache Tribal Guidance Center in coordination with the Tribal Youth Services Center.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the grant is to commence on July 01, 1985 and is to continue until such time as the terms of the Grant are fulfilled.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman and in his absence, the Vice-Chairman is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to carry out the purposes of this resolution.
