## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, some members of the Tribal Council have requested that the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe be amended in the area of election procedures; specifically, the election of the Chairman and the Vice-Chairman, and
- WHEREAS, the main concern expressed was to institute a primary election procedure for the Office of the Chairman and the Vice-Chairman prior to the General Election, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Attorney is directed to confer with the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency and report back to the Tribal Council, a time table in which an amendment of the Tribal Constitution and By-Laws could be accomplished and approved by the Secretary of the Interior; as well as, the procedures necessary to obtain secretarial approval of such an amendment.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Tribal Attorney to meet with Superintendent Russell Bradley and report back to the Council the administrative procedures and time necessary to amend the Constitution and By-Laws and to obtain the necessary secretarial approval.

The foregoing resolution was on January 30, 1985 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 3 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
