## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, tribal member ODELL DECLAY of the East Fork Community has come before the Tribal Council with a request for assistance to construct a fence around the East Fork Graveyard so as to protect young children from wandering into the Graveyard; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concurs with Mr. Declay's request and acknowledges that the fence is the responsibility of the Tribal Government; and
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the request of Mr. Odell Declay for the Tribal Government to constuct a fence around the East Fork Graveyard in order to protect small children from wandering into the environs of the Graveyard and for the preservation of this sacred area.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it request Mr. Declay to contact the office of the Chairman or Vice-Chairman so that the necessary tribal agencies or department can comply with this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on March 13, 1985 duly adopted by a vote of  $\frac{10}{\text{Apache Tribe}}$  for and  $\frac{0}{\text{pursuant}}$  against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
