## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Mrs. Irma Platt and her daughter, Pauline Platt, tribal members who reside in the upper East Fork area have requested Tribal Council assistance in regards to extensive water seepage onto their homesite from sources unknown; and
- WHEREAS, Mrs. Platt and her daughter believe that the source of the water seepage may be an underground spring and; therefore, request assistance in locating the source and a means to divert the water from their homesite; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, after some discussion, suggests that the Indian Health Service Environmental Water Division may be best qualified to investigate the source of the water seepage and to advise a plan to divert the water.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby request that Vic Byerly of the Indian Health Service investigate the water seepage problem at Mrs. Irma and Pauline Platt's homesite and report back to the Office of the Chairman and the Vice-Chairman his findings and recommendations to resolve the problem.

The foregoing resolution was on April 15, 1985, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)
