RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has recognized the lack of adequate housing for many of its tribal members, and
- WHEREAS, in an attempt to alleviate some of the problems that exist regarding the <u>severe</u> shortage of housing on the reservation, and in compliance with a Bureau of Indian Affairs request, the Tribe through the efforts of the Vice Chairmans office has complied a housing inventory survey, and
- WHEREAS, this Housing Inventory Survey, also known as Form 5-6406, must be submitted to the Phoenix Area Office by May 3 in order to identify and establish a Tribal housing need priority within the Phoenix Area Office's jurisdiction.
- BE IT RESOLVED the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that after reviewing the attached Form 5-6406, we are in agreement with the figures noted listing housing needs by Community.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that in compliance with Area Director Walter Mills request, we are submitting this information via Fort Apache Agency Superintendent Russell Bradley for his approval and consequently, forwarding to Area Office by the May 3, 1985 deadline.

The foregoing resolution was on 04-30-1985 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1(1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, Pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)
