RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that the Tribe bears a substantial financial burden because of its maintenance of several Tribal Welfare Homes, and
- WHEREAS, the Council is further advised that most, if not all, of the tenants in the welfare housing units are far behind in their rental payments, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that it would be beneficial to the Tribe if ownership of the homes was transferred to the individual tenants as their sole property so that the Tribe will no longer be responsible to maintain the homes or to pay the utilities for said homes, and
- WHEREAS, it is further suggested that the Tribe advance \$50,000.00 for individual butane hookups for the homes, but that all purchases of butane, as well as, home insurance, maintenance and utilities including water shall be paid by the tenants.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Tribal Administrative Manager to work together with the Maintenance Department and immediately transfer complete title and ownership of all of the welfare homes to the individual tenants residing therein.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it directs and authorizes the expenditure of \$50.00 per home for individual butane hookups with the understanding that it will be the tenant's sold responsibility to pay for any future butane requirements for his or her home.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that upon transfer of ownership of the welfare homes to the tenants, the Tribe will not be responsible for any maintenance, utilities, water or insurance on said homes.

The foregoing resolution was on April 26, 1985 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and by-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
