RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Mrs. Carol (Moody) Declay has come before the Tribal Council seeking assistance for herself in respect to her natural brother, John Nosie, and

WHEREAS, she explains to the Tribal Council that the foster parents for her brother have relinquished custody of her natural brother and that she has been appointed his legal guardian, and

WHEREAS, she further explains to the Tribal Council that her brother is not competent to manage his own financial affairs and is seeking to obtain his land claims money and other monies in his IIM Account with the Bureau of Indian Affairs and that she fears he will waste his money or be taken advantage of by others and end up with nothing for his welfare, and

WHEREAS, she seeks Tribal Council assistance to avoid this result.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that the Bureau of Indian Affairs and the Tribal Attorney to advise Mrs. Declay as to procedures necessary to obtain a conservatorship or like order from the Tribal Court so as to protect the assets of her ward and brother, John Nosie.

The foregoing resolution was on July 9, 1985 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 1 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
