RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council is empowered to approve of Committee Members and Board Members for approved programs on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, in the Resolution No. 84-287, the Tribal Governing Body had accordingly sanctioned eleven (11) members to the Tribal Social Services Advisory Board, and
- WHEREAS, these Board Members were to serve a two-year term and that two-year absences in succession without excuse would constitute an automatic dismissal, and
- WHEREAS, the majority of the Boa-d Members had missed two consecutive meetings, and
- WHEREAS, modification is required whereby new members are appointed to constitute an effective board to deal with programatic activities affiliated with the Human Service Center Department's operations.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the following members are automatically dismissed from the Tribal Social Services Advisory Committee:

- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this newly established board henceforth shall be named Human Service Advisory Board and that the purpose of this board will act in the advisory capacity, to advise and make recommendations to the Human Service Center Program Managers.

- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that said appointments of the Advisory Board named herein shall be effective on the day this resolution is approved.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby requests the Human Service Center Executive Director to appoint representatives from Cibecue and Canyonn Day as members of the Tribe in addition to the six names set forth in this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on July 9, 1985 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i & s) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Wecretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
