RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Mr. Gene Riggs, Tribal Architect and Engineer, has presented to the Tribal Council, a proposal for the reconstruction of the Museum to replace the Culture Center which was destroyed by fire; and
- WHEREAS, he explains to the Tribal Council that insurance funds are available to construct this museum and further points out the exact location for the new museum which will be in the Fort Apache area; and
- WHEREAS, after thorough discussion and review, the Tribal Council agrees with Mr. Riggs' recommendation, design and relocation for the museum.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the proposed plan and location for the construction of a new museum facility to be located as designated in the Fort Apache area.

The foregoing resolution was on July 9, 1985, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 1 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)
