RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, members of the Tribal Boundary Rangers Department have come before the Tribal Council with a request that the Council aid them in processing their certification as Peace Officers which they had previously obtained, but which must be upgraded and renewed; and
- WHEREAS, the need for additional training monies for certification as well as some of the other problems between other Law Enforcement Agencies and the Boundary Patrol is discussed amongst members of the Tribal Council, the Fish and Game Department and the Boundary Patrol; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that assistance should be given to the Rangers to renew their Peace Officer's Certification and to obtain training funds for that purpose.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests the Director of the Boundary Patrol Department to immediately process the Rangers' Certifications as Peace Officers and to either budget or locate training funds in order to achieve this certification.

The foregoing resolution was on July 9, 1985, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)
