RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Councilman Herbert Tate of District 4, has held three Public Meetings, two at the Canyon Day Community Building and one before the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, said meetings were held for the purpose of complying with the Rules and Regulations mandated by the Federal Revenue Sharing Act; and
- WHEREAS, no objections or negative concerns were voiced or filed against the Canyon Day Community Building and other community facilities for the people of the Canyon Day Community; and
- WHEREAS, bids have been solicited for the Project at a low cost bid of \$19,960.00.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the expenditure of \$19,960.00 or less from Federal Revenue Sharing Funds for the purpose of improving the Community Facilities for the Community of Canyon Day.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that Councilman Herbert Tate is authorized to execute all documents and proceed with the completion of the Improvement Project and upon completion of the Project to provide adequate documentation in a written report to the Tribal Council to demonstrate that the purpose for which the funds were appropriated has been served.

The foregoing resolution was on August 1, 1985, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)
