RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, in order to allocate priorities and determine the greatest need for the people of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, must have information from the Human Service Center in respect to ongoing programs, contracts, sources of funds and distribution of funds for all of the components of the Human Service Center, and
- WHEREAS, the Human Service Center is in possession of said materials and most qualified to provide these materials in summary form to the members of the Tribal Council.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that the Director of the Human Service Center provide to each and every member of the Tribal Council, full information regarding, all of the components and divisions, programs, contracts, funds and distribution of goods and services at the earliest possible convenience so that the Tribal Council can review and examine tribal priorities in this area.

The foregoing resolution was on August 07, 1985 duly adopted by a vote of 9 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
