RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, by previous resolution, the Tribal Council requested the Director of the Utility Authority to resolve the water shortage problem in the Seven-Mile Community, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is continuously receiving complaints of the persistent water problem at the Seven-Mile Community and it appears that the problem remains unresolved.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apaché Tribe that it hereby requests that the Director of the Utility Authority provide a report to the Office of the Chairman and Vice-Chairman as to any and all efforts made to resolve the water shortage problem now existing in the Seven-Mile Community.

The foregoing resolution was on August 7, 1985 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and ey-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
