## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has received information that the fire hazard existing at the McNary Small Log Mill, operative by Ron Kidd, remains unchanged and continues to be a serious fire hazard for the whole community, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that regardless of the person or persons who has made the problem it legally remains the obligation of the assignee, Mr. Kidd.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that the present assignee of the McNary Small Log Mill lease, immediately commence the cleanup of the wood debris on the premises of the sawmill and that he reports to the Chairman and Vice-Chairman's Offices, as well as, the Superintendent of the Bureau of Indian Affairs, his efforts to remove the existing fire hazard.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it directs that a copy of this resolution be mailed to Mr. Kidd.

The foregoing resolution was on August 07, 1985 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
