RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has requested that the Bureau of Indian Affairs rebuild Route 61, Diamond Creek Road, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe wishes to grant a gratuitous Right-of-Way, varying in width from 100 feet to 180 feet, for a total distance of 4.236 miles.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants to the Bureau of Indian Affairs a gratuitous Right-of-Way as recorded on Drawing No. FA-61-5, on file in the Office of the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona, to which reference is hereby made.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that no fencing of the Right-of-Way take place on this section of Route 61.

The foregoing resolution was on August 07, 1985 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
