RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Attorney advises the Tribal Council that Tribal Planner,
 John Neilson has made application for and received year-end
 Bureau of Indian Affairs monies in the amount of approximately \$40,000.
 for a Juvenile Diversion Program to be administered by the Tribal
 Juvenile Court, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Attorney further explains that the budget and utilization of these funds was developed pursuant to discussions with Robert Hershey, LELA, Tribal Attorney, and the Juvenile Court Judge and that said budget will allow for the employment of three Tribal members as Counselors; as well as, consulting services of Robert Hershey to coordinate the program, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is requested to approve the use of said funds for said purpose, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council agrees that the goals and purposes of a Juvenile : Diversion Program are gravely needed on the reservation and will assist in diminishing the number of juveniles processed through the Tribal Criminal Justice System.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the application for, receipt of and use of the Bureau of Indian Affairs monies described herein for the Juvenile Diversion Program.

The foregoing resolution was on September 11, 1985 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
