RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has received a report that the present East Fork homesite of the Delano Keyes family, known as Lot No. 27 is designated to have a HUD home constructed thereon, but that said home will overlap on an adjacent lot that belongs to someone else, and
- WHEREAS, the location of the proposed Keyes home was determined by the Housing Authority and that the resulting boundary dispute is the responsibility of the Housing Authority to resolve in a manner agreeable to all parties at the Housing Authority expense.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests the Housing Authority to relocate the present building site for the construction of the Keyes' family HUD home on Lot 27 to a / location within their land assignment which will not overlap or; otherwise, intrude upon another family's land assignment.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that any moving and survey costs should be borne by the Housing Authority rather than the Keyes family or any other Tribal Enterprise.

The foregoing resolution was on September 17, 1985 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
