PESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has received many requests from tribal members for adequate roads to farmlands presently under cultivation by tribal members, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has also received requests for adequate roads to farmlands which now remain fallow because of inadequate roads to those farmlands, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that the Bureau of Indian Affairs Roads Department should thoroughly assess the need for a road system to and from these farmlands so that they can be brought under cultivation and; thereby, contribute to the economic wellbeing of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency to direct the Bureau's Land and Road Operations Departments to investigate the adequacy of the present road system to tribal farmlands and present a report to the Tribal Council in regards to those farmlands which do not have adequate roads, together with estimates of the time necessary to construct an adequate road system to those individual farmlands.

The foregoing resolution was on October 17, 1985 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
