RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Northern Arizona University Institute for Human Development has in the past and is currently sponsoring the Whiteriver Infant Stimulation and Preschool Program for handicapped infants and preschool children; and
- WHEREAS, the program has previously used a classroom at Headstart but due to the increased enrollment in Headstart, the Headstart facilities are no longer available for the program; and
- WHEREAS, Councilman, Lafe Altaha; Headstart Director, Claude Endfield; and Program Coordinator, Diane Lenz, have advised the Tribal Council of the importance of the program and have further requested the use of a classroom at Alchesay Hall to continue the program; ... and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been further advised that a maintained classroom facility is required on a daily basis for 12 months per year for the operation of the program; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council recognizes the benefits received by the program and the importance to continue its operation.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain
 Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the in-kind
 contribution of the Alchesay Hall Classroom for the
 exclusive use of the Whiteriver Infant Stimulation
 and Preschool Program.

The foregoing resolution was on October 17, 1985, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 () of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)
