## . RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has received numerous complaints that house movers are operating in the Hawley Lake area and taking expired leased cabins off the reservation in violation of a prior Council resolution requiring that any house movers be licensed and bonded from the State of Arizona, as well as, the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and that they pay for a trader's permit prior to operating on the reservation, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has also received complaints that certain house movers are circumventing lease provisions and Tribal Policies regarding the removal of homes within ninety (90) days after the expiration of the lease, and
- WHEREAS, the Council concludes that an ordinance should be drafted setting forth penalties for violation of Tribal Policies and to establish a policy for house movers on the reservation.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Tribal Attorney to draft a house mover's ordinance for review and consideration by the Tribal Council.

The foregoing resolution was on November 12, 1985 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the sribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
