## . RESOULUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Dr. Tim Strand, formerly with the Indian Health Service, has requested Tribal Council approval for a proposed Milk Project and study on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, Dr. Strand explains to the Council, in part, that he desires to have access to patient charts in order to study the effects of milk use on the health of Apache mothers, and
- WHEREAS, the Indian Health Service Hospital Administration in Whiteriver is opposed to the study for various reasons in letters to the Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that it would be in the best interest of the Tribe if a Committee is formed composed of Council members Alvino Hawkins, Chairman Lupe, Vice-Chairman Johnson, Carla Alchesay-Nachu, Hospital Director, Dr. Caldwell of the Indian Health Service and Dr. Tim Strand in order to meet and discuss the pros and cons of Dr. Strand's proposal.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby tables Dr. Strand's proposal until such time as the aforenamed Committee has had the opportunity to meet and discuss the advantages, disadvantages and feasibility of Dr. Strand's proposal.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that the Committee report any findings and recommendations to the Tribal Council at a regularly scheduled Tribal Council Meeting.

The foregoing resolution was on December 4, 1985 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
