RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Darvin Burnette has come before the Tribal Council on behalf of McNeil Toggie and advises the Tribal Council that Mr. Toggie, a tribal member, has been working as a janitor for the tribe since 1952 in Memorial Hall and has accumulated a total of 31 years of tribal service, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is further advised that Mr. Toggie has accumulated excess sick leave and has been working for the tribe at a very low salary including weekends, has walked to work from East Fork for many years, and further has the burden of a very sick wife whom he has to take care of, and
- WHEREAS, after considerable discussion by the Tribal Council regarding Mr. Toggie's lengthy tribal employment, the history of his wages and his particular special needs due to his own health condition and that of his wife, concludes that he should be granted an early retirement without jeopardizing the amount of his retirement benefits.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Tribal Personnel Department to determine the amount of leave, both annual and sick possibly accumulated by Mr. Toggie and that upon the expiration of Mr. Toggie's excess sick leave and annual leave, his retirement may commence, but that during the period of time when he is on annual leave and sick leave he shall not accrue additional annual or sick leave.

The foregoing resolution was on December 05, 1985 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
