

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Dr. Jefferson Reid, Archaeologist from the University of Arizona, has come before the Tribal Council with a request that the field school at the Grasshopper Archaeological site be renewed for 1986; and

WHEREAS, the field school will be operating at Grasshopper beginning June 7, 1986 for a period of six weeks with fifteen graduate students; and

WHEREAS, recent revisions of Department of the Interior regulations require that archaeology permits be renewed annually instead of every three or five years; hence Dr. Reid's request at this time; and

WHEREAS, after some discussion with the Tribal Council in respect to early Apache settlements and the Grasshopper site, the Tribal Council concludes that approval should be granted for the summer field school at Grasshopper for the time requested.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves Dr. Reid's request for permission to operate the Grasshopper field school commencing June 7, 1986 for a term of six weeks.

The foregoing resolution was on February 5, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (g&i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)
