

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, by Resolution 85-153, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council approved and affirmed the FY 85-86 Tribal OEDP Update; and

WHEREAS, said update specifically referenced and authorized the provision of basic community infrastructure necessary to the quality of life on the reservation, with specific attention to those problems in the McNary-Hondah area; and

WHEREAS, existing HUD funds (B85-SR-04-0817) are already at work in the McNary community (\$486,000.) to modernize the sewer system but are, by Indian Health Service estimates, approximately \$115,000. short of the total sewer system funding needed for the McNary area; and


WHEREAS, the Hondah area has an historical, serious community sewage problem which yields serious impacts on community health and has seriously polluted nearby tribal water resources, including Bootleg and Cooley Lake; and

WHEREAS, the Economic Development Administration and the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (Community Development Block Grant Program) have indicated that they will consider a joint application (EDA \$300,000.; HUD \$500,000.) to address this important problem; and


WHEREAS, an overall sewage system in the McNary-Hondah area will not only alleviate the health problems described, but substantially improve development and employment opportunities for the overall area.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves and authorizes applications to the Economic Development Administration and the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for an Overall project of \$800,000. to complete the McNary-Hondah sewer system, and that the Tribal Chairman, and in his absence, the Vice Chairman, is authorized to conduct all negotiations pursuant to funding and contracting of said application and implementation.

The foregoing resolution was on February 5, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 1 abstention by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)
