## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Tribal member, Max Goklish has come before the Tribal Council and expressed his concern that persons may be planning to encroach upon his ancestral land that he has occupied for many, many years and which before him were occupied by his ancestors in the area known as Alchesay Flat Community, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council having made inquiry to the Chairperson of the Land Board Committee concludes that there is claim conflict or planned encroachment to the lands presently occupied by Mr. Goklish, but concludes that his right to that land be reaffirmed and publicly acknowledged by the Tribal Council.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby officially acknowledges, recognizes and reaffirms Mr. Max Goklish's ancestral and personal right to the land he presently occupies known as Alchesay Flat Community.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it directs that a copy of this Resolution be filed with the Tribal Realty Office and Land Board Office as a permanent record of Mr. Max Goklish's right of occupancy to this land.

The foregoing resolution was on March 12, 1986 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
