

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council wishes to express its non-partisan appreciation to outgoing Tribal Chairman Ronnie Lupe for his sixteen years of service to the White Mountain Apache Tribe as Chairman of the Tribal Council and 2 years service as Councilman from East Fork; and
- WHEREAS, during his term as Chairman, Mr. Lupe accomplished many long lasting achievements for the White Mountain Apache Tribe such as the Apache Sunrise Ski Area, the Fort Apache Timber Company, the Whiteriver Shopping Center, Sanitation Improvements, the Cibecue Clinic Community Center, Housing in every Community, and the PHS Hospital in Whiteriver, and has zealously defended the Tribal Homeland, Tribal Water Rights and other natural resources; and
- WHEREAS, having occupied the Tribal Chairman's Office for so many years the Tribal Council concludes it is fitting and proper that the desk he designed and used be retired and presented to him together with the 1982 Lincoln as a irrevocable gift in honor of his long service; and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 83-157 the Tribal Council has established an honorarium for past Chairmen in the amount of \$200.00 per month and that Mr. Lupe is entitled to said Honorarium.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that in Recognition of Mr. Lupe's long standing service to the White Mountain Apache Tribe that he is hereby presented an irrevocable gift the Chairman's Desk he designed and used these past 16 years, the 1982 Lincoln he used during his tenure, and the Chairmen honorarium previously established by the Tribal Council.

The foregoing resolution was on April 30, 1986 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 3 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1(b.h.i & u) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).


