


RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, representatives of the Carrizo Community have proposed to the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that \$2,823.00 be expended from the Carrizo Community's Land Claim Funds for work completed in erecting four telephone poles necessary to restore television reception for the Carrizo Community; and
- WHEREAS, a majority of the citizens of the Carrizo Community have requested by signature, that payment be made from the Carrizo Land Claims Recreation Fund for the purpose of paying for the television relay equipment and telephone poles in order to restore entertainment to the community for both young and elderly; and
- WHEREAS, a copy of the petition of the Carrizo Community, signed on March 6, 1986, is attached to this resolution and incorporated by reference herein; and
- WHEREAS, also attached to the resolution is a copy of the quotation from Richard J. Palmer Companies for the four telephone post holes and erection of four telephone poles for television relay equipment which will be installed at a future date; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that the Carrizo Community organization has satisfied the prerequisites for the expenditure of monies from the Carrizo Land Claims Recreation Fund and that the proposed expenditure is proper and will benefit the recreational needs of the community.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the proposal of the Carrizo Community Organization for the expenditure of \$2,823.00 for the erection of four telephone poles for television relay equipment to be installed at a later date.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby authorizes the Chairman, and in his absence the Vice Chairman, to sign any and all necessary vouchers for the payment of \$2,823.00 from the Land Claims Recreation Fund to Richard J. Palmer Companies of McNary, Arizona.

The foregoing resolution was on April 16, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)
